Antoniolo is one of the top names in Northern Piedmont. Sadly, 2011 appears to have been a very challenging vintage here. The entry-level Gattinara is solid, but the single-vineyard wines - the estate's flagships - are all marked by strident tannins. I tasted those wines twice, several months apart, hoping to see at least some improvement in bottle, but that never materialized.
